A JESUS BREVIARY

31 days of God's Love-Call

These are all from the Hebrew Bible, to help sit with God saying "I love you" for as long as we can stand it. If a new awareness of sin surfaces, be not afraid.

31 days of Jesus Incarnate

That God would enter human history as one like us in all things but sin was unexpected and laughed at when preached, the surprise of the Word made flesh.

31 days of Jesus Miracles

The Son of God shows forth the divine dynamic power in signs opening minds, hearts, souls, and strength.

31 days of Jesus Parables

Which parable leaves you most perplexed? You will want to waste a lot of time on it. Which one seems clear-cut? That one too, until you are perplexed again.

31 days of Jesus Sayings

These are in Sunday gospel readings in the 3 year cycle.

31 days of Jesus' Paschal Mystery

The full gift of the self of Jesus in his scandalous cross shows through his death and resurrection to Easter joy.

31 days of the Holy Spirit

Jesus told us that *the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete, will teach* us *all things* (John 14:26), the Holy Breath of God.

31 days on the Christian Life

These timeless readings from the letters attributed to Saints Peter, Paul, John, and James are drawn from Morning and Evening Prayer in the *Liturgy of the Hours*.

31 days of GOD'S LOVE-CALL

What do you hear when you read God's word in the Bible? I hear a very long love letter. The Bible as a whole can be read in this simple message from God:

I made you, I know you, and I love you.

This can be a message of great consolation. If I am aware of not living as if God loves me, it can nudge as a challenge, not to be better to earn God's love, but a reminder of my desire to live a fidelity-response to God's complete love for me.

It has been an honor to journey with many good folks in the *Spiritual Exercises* of St. Ignatius of Loyola in At-Home Retreats and in spiritual direction. The first part of the exercises is to sit with intention in the reality of God's provision and love. This means letting God say and repeat, *I love you*. These 31 passages rendered here without commentary can help let this message sink into one's being. Though most of them are psalms and canticles to sing to God, as scripture they are also meant to be read as part of God's revelation; so whether the words are addressed to God, to someone else, or to the reader, we can hear them as God's love letter to us.

The ancient way of listening to God in *lectio divina* can be as simple as choosing a word or phrase or image from the passage, sitting with it perhaps without thinking about it, and breathing to listen.

And so, our concern will be to see all good things in unbiased balance, and we will not prefer health to sickness, riches to poverty, the world's honor to its dishonor, or a long life to a short life, and this balance of indifference will hold for all other things.

When my one desire comes to be whatever is more conducive to the purpose/reason/end/... for which I am created, may my choices reflect that desire.

If not now, when?

The Principle and Foundation of St. Ignatius of Loyola, d. 1556 is usually part of the first days of *The Spiritual Exercises* (para. 23).

31 days of JESUS INCARNATE

rendered for meditation in the present tense

Jesus is that man who lived in the first third of what we now call the first century, near the Sea of Galilee in what is now called Israel, who we also know as Son of God, Christ the Anointed One, Savior, Redeemer, Risen Lord, and a host of other names.

Incarnate means enfleshed or embodied, or for Christians, the Word become Flesh. This means that God has chosen to enter human history as one of us. Tell a little child that there was a day when Jesus was exactly as tall as he or she is today. Tell a teen that Jesus too lived in his own in-betweenness. Tell a student that Jesus too had to learn. Tell the adult being tempted that so was Jesus, one like us in all things but sin.

Anytime we proclaim his divinity, his God-ness, to the diminishment of his humanity, we may fall into what we call heresy. And anytime we proclaim his humanity to the exclusion of his divinity, we may fall into heresy. For a Christian, Jesus is Son of God and Son of a human being, Mary. He is fully God and fully human, not half God and half man, as a teacher would say, not only God on his Poppa's side and human on his Momma's side, but completely God and completely human. The two natures of the one person of Jesus can be seen in these gospel classics.

Be in the story. Imagine yourself as a character in the scene. What do you see, hear, smell, taste and feel?

2 CATCH of FISH

4 GOOD SAMARITAN

31 days of JESUS SAYINGS

an incomplete list, most from Sunday readings

Many good people have written books with titles such as *The Life of Jesus* or *A Life of Christ*. This is not one of those.

In addition to the four canonical or church-sanctioned gospels of *Matthew*, *Mark*, *Luke* and *John*, there are other books called *gospels* from near ancient times, and some folks have composed even to recent years accounts of the *evangelion* or *good news* of Jesus Christ. It could even be an instructive exercise for a modern Christian to write out how he or she might tell the story of the Baptism of the Lord, his three-year ministry of teaching and healing, his Passion and death on the cross, and his Resurrection and Ascension. (See Acts 1:22 for how this capacity might qualify one to be an *apostle*.) But this is not one of those.

Scripture scholars have identified a number of passages that can be found in both *Matthew* and *Luke* which are not in either *Mark* or *John*. Based on the most commonly accepted notion of how the gospels were written: *Mark*, perhaps around the year 75(?), from oral traditions; *Matthew* and *Luke*, perhaps around the mid-80's; and *John*, perhaps in the 90's; that each of the four has material in none of the others; that both *Matthew* and *Luke* relied heavily on *Mark*; and that there is matching material in *Matthew* and *Luke* which is not in *Mark* or in *John*, so a theory has evolved that there was a long-lost collection of *Sayings of Jesus*, or a *gospel* often called "Q" after the German word *Quelle* or "source,"

which both *Matthew* and *Luke* seem to have put to good use. Many have composed possible lists of these sayings of Jesus. This is not one of those.

So what is this? It is simply a meditation rendering of words attributed to Jesus by the writers of the gospels that one parish priest has found helpful in praying *Lectio Divina*, while walking in the woods or on a treadmill or other torture device, driving here and there, or rocking in a chair like a hungry old bear. Nothing more. There could be many ways to use a collection such as this:

- a. One a day for the 31 days of a month, like a vitamin.
- b. Choosing a saying or a phrase to pray, and breathing with it through the day.
- c. Wanting an introduction to this Jesus of Nazareth.
- d. Searching for some healing words of consolation.
- e. Being open to a message of challenge from the Loving Savior.
- f. A doorway into the gospel context of a saying that intrigues.
- g. The ongoing search for the gospel account or parable that is for me "the gospel within the gospels."
- h. With extra time on my hands, finally getting around to sitting with those "hard" sayings of Jesus.
- i. A way to begin a new dialogue with Christ the Lord.
- j. Admitting the desire to be a disciple of the Master Teacher.
- k. Looking to listen to God in patient anticipation of a surprise.

REBIRTH to a LIVING HOPE

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whose great mercy we are given rebirth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to the inheritance that is incorruptible, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you by the power of God, guarded through faith to a salvation ready to be revealed at the end time.

These things abounding in you will keep you from being barren and unfruitful in full knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. Blind and short sighted is the one who lacks these things, and forgetful of how his or her sins were cleansed. Brothers and sisters, be diligent in your call and firm in your choice and you will not fail in what you do. Richly supplied will be your entry into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

10 GRACE of GOD

Now without law, the justice of God has shown forth, witnessed by the law and the prophets, justice of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe.

There is no difference for all have sinned and come short of the glory of God and are made just freely by God's grace through the redemption in Christ Jesus, in whom God set forth an expiation through faith by his blood, for a showing forth of his justice because of the disappearance of the sins previously committed, in the forbearance of God, for the showing forth of justice in the present time, that God should be just and make just those of faith in Jesus.

So where is the boasting? It was shut out. Through what law? of works? No, but through a law of faith. For we reckon a person to be made just by faith apart from works of the law. Or is God of Judeans only? Not also of nations? Yes, also of nations, since there is one God who will make just circumcision by faith and uncircumcision through the faith. So do we destroy law through faith? May it not be. But we support the law.

13 I AM PERSUADED

Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Affliction? Distress? Persecution? Famine? Nakedness? Peril? The Sword? But in all these things we overconquer through the one who has loved us. You shall love your neighbor as yourself,

you do well.

But if you are partial to certain persons you work sin

and are reproved by the law as transgressors for the one who keeps all the law but stumbles in one thing has become guilty of all.

For the one saying,

Do not commit adultery,

said also,

Do not murder.

Now if you do not commit adultery
but murder

you have become a transgressor of the law. So speak and so do

as one about to be judged through a law of freedom.

For judgment will be unmerciful to the one not doing mercy; mercy triumphs over judgment.

Saint James, Letter of James 2:1-13

18 ONE IS the LAWGIVER & JUDGE

From where come wars and fights among you? Not from your pleasures soldiering in your members? You desire and do not have; you murder and are jealous and are unable to obtain; you fight and you war. You have not because you ask not; you ask and receive not because you ask badly that you may spend in your pleasures. Adulterers, do you not know that the friendship of the cosmos is enmity with God? And so whoever resolves to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God. Or do you think that the scripture says in vain that, the Spirit which dwelt in you yearns in envy? But we are given greater grace, and so it says, God resists the arrogant, but gives grace to the humble.

And so be subject to God, but oppose the diabolo who will flee from you.

Draw near to God who will draw near to you.

Cleanse your hands, sinners; and purify hearts, you two-souled.

Be distressed and mourn and weep; let your laughter be turned to mourning and your joy to dejection.

Be humbled before the Lord who will exalt you.

Do not speak against each other, brothers and sisters.

The one speaking against a brother or judging a sister speaks against the law and judges the law.

And if you judge the law

you are not a doer of law but a judge.

One is the lawgiver and judge: the one able to save and to destroy. Who are you to be judging your neighbor?

19 CHARISMS

I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, through the compassion of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and well-pleasing to God, your worship and reasonable service.

Do not conform to this eon but be transformed by the renewal of your mind that what you do may be proven to be the will of God, the good and wellpleasing and perfect. For through the grace given to me I say to everyone among you, to not have high thoughts beyond what is needed, but think to be sober-minded, to each as God allocated a measure of faith.

For as in one body we have many members, but not all the members have the same action, so we the many are one body in Christ and each one members of one another.

And having charisms as the *charin*-grace given to us differs, whether prophecy in the proportion of the faith, or serving in the service-ministry, or the one teaching in the teaching, the one exhorting in the exhortation, the one sharing in simplicity, the one taking the lead in diligence, or the one showing mercy in cheerfulness.

20 GOOD STEWARDS of GRACE

Now of all things the end has drawn near. And so be sober in mind and sober in prayer. Before yourselves in all things have fervent love for love covers a multitude of sins. If anyone speaks as words of God; if anyone service-ministers as by strength supplied by God, so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ to whom is the glory and the might to the eons of the eons. 21SUFFICIENT to YOU IS MY GRACE

My need to boast is indeed not expedient,

three times I begged the Lord that it might depart from me.

And he said to me,

"Sufficient to you is my grace, for my power is perfected in weakness."

And so

I will boast most gladly rather in my weakness

that overshadowing me might be the power of Christ.

I am content in weakness, insult, hardship, persecution, and constraint for Christ.

When I am weak, then I am in power.

22 To THIS YOU WERE CALLED

Now the end, all of you be of one mind, sympathetic, loving as siblings, compassionate, humble in mind, not giving back evil for evil to revile when reviled, but on the contrary a blessing, because to this you were called that you might inherit blessing. Let the one wishing to love life and see good days restrain the tongue from evil and speak no guile by the lips and turn aside from evil and do good. Let that one seek peace and pursue it.

23 LET ENDURANCE WORK

Deem it all joy, brothers and sisters, whenever you fall into various trials, knowing that what is approved in your faith works to endurance. And let endurance work toward the perfect best fit, that you may be perfect and whole, wanting in nothing.

But if any of you is wanting in wisdom, ask from God who gives to all unreservedly without reproach, and it will be given. But let the asking be in faith, doubting nothing. For one doubting is like a wave of the sea driven by wind and tossed. For let the two-souled person unsettled in all his or her ways not expect to receive anything from the Lord.

But let the humble brother or sister boast in a height and in humiliation the rich one who will pass away with all as does a flower of grass. For the sun rises with the hot wind and dries the grass and its flower falls out and its handsome face perishes. Thus also will the rich person in his or her goings fade away.

24

GOD IS the ONE WORKING in YOU

My beloved, as always you obeyed not only in my presence but rather now even more in my absence with fear and trembling you work out your salvation, for God is the one working in you both to will and to work on behalf of God's good will. Do all things without murmurings and disputes that you may be blameless and harmless, children of God faultless in the midst of a crooked generation. Among those having been corrupted you shine as luminaries in the world holding up a word of life, a boast to me in the day of Christ that not in vain did I run nor in vain labor.

25 THIS IS MY GOSPEL

And so you, my child, be empowered by the grace in Christ Jesus. And the things you heard from me through many witnesses, commit these to faithful people who will be competent to also teach others. Suffer ill as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. No soldiers are involved with the affairs of life so that they may please those who enlist them. Also in athletics one is not crowned without competing by the rules. It is best if the laboring farmer is the first to partake of crops. Ponder what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in all things.

Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, of the seed of David: this is my gospel in which I suffer and am in chains as if an evildoer. But the word of God has not been chained. And so I endure all things for the chosen ones that they also may obtain salvation in Christ Jesus with eternal glory. Faithful is the word: If we died with him we shall also live with him; if we endure we shall also reign with him; if we deny, that one will also deny us; if we disbelieve, that one remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself.

26 For GOOD & for BUILDING UP

We who have power
ought to bear the weaknesses
of those who are not in power
and not to please ourselves.
Let each one of us please his or her neighbor
for good and for building up,
for even Christ pleased not himself.
As it has been written,
The reproaches of those reproaching you
fell on me.

What was written for our teaching was written that through patience and through the comfort of the writings we may have hope.

May the God of patience and comfort give to you the same mind among yourselves

in accord with Christ Jesus.

27 WALK as HE HIMSELF WALKED

My little children, I write these things to you that you will not sin. If anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father: Jesus Christ the Just, expiation for our sins, and not only for ours but also for those of all the world. By this we know that we have known him: if we keep his commandments. The one saying, "I have known him," not keeping his commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in this one. Whoever keeps the word, truly in this one the love of God has been made complete. By this we know that we are in him: The one claiming to remain in him ought walk as he himself walked.

28 PUT ON the NEW HUMAN

Put to death what on the earth is in you: fornication, uncleanness, lust, bad desire, and greed that is idolatry. The anger of God is coming because of these, in which indeed you then walked when you lived in these things. But now put away all such things as anger, rage, malice, blasphemy, abuse out of your mouth, and do not lie to one another, having put off the old human with its practices and having put on the new human renewed in full knowledge in the image of the one creating you, where there is no separate place for Greek or Judean, circumcision or uncircumcision, barbarian or Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all and in all. As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, put on yourselves bowels of compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience.

Bear with one another and if anyone has a complaint against anyone, forgive.

As indeed the Lord forgave, so also you.

Over all these things

put on love

which is the complete bonding.

And let rule in your hearts

the peace of Christ

to which indeed you were called in one body,

and be thankful.

Let the word of Christ indwell in you richly, teaching in all wisdom and admonishing one another in psalms, hymns, and with spiritual songs singing in your hearts to God.

And everything whatever you do

in word or in work,
do all things
in the name of the Lord Jesus,
giving thanks through him
to God the Father.

29 BE RECONCILED

You having been alienated and in enmity of mind by your bad works, now be reconciled through his death in the body of his flesh, to present you holy and without blame or reproach before him if indeed you continue in the faith having been founded and steadfast and unseparated from the hope of the gospel which you heard proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I Paul became a minister.

Now I rejoice in my sufferings on behalf of you, and fill up the things lacking of the afflictions of Christ in my flesh on behalf of his body, which is the Church, of which I became a minister according to the stewardship of God given to me for you, to fulfill the word of God, the mystery hidden from the eons and from the generations but now shown to his saints, to whom God wished to make known among the nations what is the riches of the glory of this mystery, Christ in you, the hope of glory.

We proclaim him, warning every human and teaching every human in all wisdom that we may present every human complete in Christ.

30 CHRIST LIVES in ME

Judeans by birth and not sinners of ethnon-nations, we know that a human is not made just by works of law but through faith in Christ Jesus. And we believed in Christ Jesus that we might be made just by faith in Christ and not by works of law, for no flesh will be made just by works of law. But if seeking to be made just in Christ we are also found to be sinners, then is Christ a minister of sin? May it not be! For if I build again the things I destroyed then I myself am a transgressor. For through law I died to law that to God I might live. I have been crucified with Christ and I live no longer I but Christ lives in me. And what I live now in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God loving me and giving up himself on my behalf. I do not set aside the grace of God for if our being made just comes through law then Christ died for no reason.

NEW HEAVENS and a NEW EARTH

Beloved, I write to remind you and rouse the sincerity of your mind, to remember the words spoken by the holy prophets and to you by the apostles, the command of the Lord and Savior.

Know this first, that there will come during the last of the days scoffers scoffing and going after their own desires saying, "Where is the promise of his *parousia*-presence? From the day when our ancestors fell asleep, all things remain as from the beginning of creation." It is concealed from them as they wish, that of old the heavens were and that the earth out of water and through water was formed by the word of God. Through these the world of then was deluged by water and perished. The heavens and the earth are now by the same word stored up for fire, being kept for a day of judgment and destruction of ungodly humans.

But let this one thing not be concealed from you, beloved, that one day with the Lord is as a thousand years and a thousand years as day one. The Lord is not slow on his promise, as some deem slowness, but is patient with you, not for the purpose that any perish but that all people might come to conversion.

But the day of the Lord will come as a thief, in which the heavens will pass away with a rushing sound and the elements burning will be dissolved and the earth and its works will be uncovered.

All these things to happen, what sort of people need we be in holy conduct and piety as we await and hasten the coming of the day of God, on account of which the heavens set on fire will be dissolved and the elements burn and melt?

We await new heavens and a new earth in accord with his promise, in which justice dwells. And so, beloved, awaiting these things be diligent to be spotless and unblemished, to be found by him in peace.

Deem the patience of our Lord as salvation, as indeed our beloved brother Paul wrote to you by the wisdom given to him by God, as also in all his epistles, speaking in them about these things, in which some things are hard to understand, which the unlearned and unsteady twist, as with the rest of scriptures, to their own destruction.

Knowing this, beloved, guard lest being led away by lawless error you fall from your own stability. But grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him is the glory both now and to the eternal day.
